9. Statement of Project Goals and Objectives: Control erosion on roads and trails in Jacksonville Creek, particularly in granitic soil locations.

10. Project Description: (Provide concise description of project and attach map.)

The roads and trails in Jackson Creek produce large loads of sediment. The roads and trails were built many years ago for mining and logging access and are often of poor location and design. Roads and trails of particular concern are those built on very erosive granite soils. The erosive condition is compounded by heavy vehicle use on roads and OHV use on trails. This proposal would provide for some reconstruction of sections of road # 37-3-25, particularly on granite portions: In-sloping, adding culverts and down-spouts where necessary, water dips, pitrun surfacing including ditchline, armoring or decommissioning some trail locations.

a. **What measures or evaluations will be made to determine how well the proposed project meets the desired ecological conditions? [Sec. 203(b)(6)] Who will be responsible for this monitoring item?** Project will be evaluated on approximately a weekly basis and particularly after storm events. Roads, Trails and streams will be monitored for sediment and erosion sources. The Jacksonville City Forester will be responsible for monitoring which will be performed mostly in conjunction with other City projects.

b. **How will the project be evaluated to determine how well the proposed project contributes towards local employment and/or training opportunities, including summer youth jobs programs such as the Youth Conservation Corps? [Sec. 203(b)(6)] Who will be responsible for this monitoring item?**

- Project workforce and economic impact to local economy will be recorded.
- Jackson County youth work program will be using this infrastructure to access projects in the watershed.
- Oregon State University, Forestry Extension Agent, uses forests and infrastructure in Jackson Creek Watershed for classwork and forest landowner demonstrations.


