**9. Statement of Project Goals and Objectives:**

The project objective is to identify, treat and control noxious weeds (Purple Loosestrife, Starthistle, Scotch Broom, various Knapweeds) along the recreation section of the Rogue River (Applegate River to Grave Creek).

**10. Project Description:** (Provide concise description of project and attach map.)

The project has three parts: 1) surveys to determine the extent and intensity of noxious weed infestation; 2) weed control/treatment efforts; and 3) effectiveness monitoring.

Surveys and preliminary control efforts will be implemented the first year of the project. Subsequent years will involve a combination of treatment and monitoring. Control efforts will be focused on areas that receive high levels of public use - including but not limited to BLM and county owned land. The primary noxious weed treatment method will be hand pulling and cutting, and potentially limited hand-applied herbicide use (where mechanical methods are not feasible for control) in accordance with the Medford District's Integrated Weed Management Plan and Environmental Assessment (EA) #OR-110-98-14.

The project will be implemented in conjunction with a current noxious weed control project occurring on BLM land from Grave Creek to Marial on the Wild and Scenic section of the Rogue River. In addition, the Middle Rogue Watershed Council (MRWC) plans to conduct a noxious weed survey among land owners along the Rogue River. Results will be shared with the BLM and analyzed to determine if cooperative efforts with the MRWC and private landowners would be effective at controlling infestations along the river.

Area of infestation and density will be assessed annually at all major infestations. Smaller infestations will be evaluated by presence or absence of noxious weeds. All sites that receive high levels of usage by the public will be annually surveyed and monitored (BLM rec sites, boat ramps, county parks, etc.). The project sponsor is responsible for monitoring.
