### Spring Recreation Site

Spring Recreation Site, located on the Oregon/Idaho border north of Ontario, offers a desert canyon experience on the banks of the Snake River's Brownlee Reservoir. Brownlee Reservoir is known for its large channel catfish, abundant crappie, and good bass fishing. Spring Recreation

Site offers one of the best boat launches on the Oregon side of Brownlee Reservoir. A dock has been installed to assist boaters. Families and large groups are attracted to the large sites and easy access to the water.

The RV and tent campground makes an excellent basecamp as you explore the region. Oregon Trail wagon ruts are visible just up the road. The National Oregon Trail Interpretive Center is less than an hour away in Baker City.

Activities:



Facilities: The camping area has 35 undefined sites, vault toilets, and drinking water in the summer time. There are picnic tables, fire rings and shade under the poplar and locust trees.

The day-use area has a boat ramp and dock, fish cleaning station, vault toilets, and large parking lots for vehicles and trailers.

Fees:       Campground: \$5 per night per vehicle.  
                  Camping is first come, first serve.  
                  Pets allowed on leash.  
                  Maximum stay of 14 days.

Day-use area: No fees  
                  Pets allowed on leash.

Season:     Open all year.  
                  Fee only May 1- October 1.
